A WORD FROM THE PASTOR



Thank you again for your continued financial support of our church and its ministries and missions in 2014! We are still receiving Ministry Budget Pledge Cards and are grateful for each and every pledge. If you have already turned in your pledge card, thank you. If you have not yet had an opportunity to do so, it is not too late! Simply drop your pledge card in the mail, bring it by the church's financial office or put it in the offering plate during any worship service. If you need another card, extras are available at the Welcome Desk in the Narthex and in the Church Office.

I want to let you know about several important events going on in the life of our church during the month of November:

1. On Sunday, November 10th, we have a special Veteran's Day Program in the Chapel at 6:00 pm with a light supper at 5:00 pm in the Fellowship Hall.
2. On Sunday, November 17th, our District Superintendent, Rev. Bob Alford, will be preaching at both morning worship services. We will be blessed by his presence with us as well as the message he will have for us!
3. We also have Missions displayed in the Narthex on both of these Sundays! Come and see what some of the ministries and missions we support are doing in the Narthex either before or after worship in the morning.

Celebrating Gifts and Year-End Giving

Thank you for your faithfulness in giving. As we enter the final months of the year, here are some ideas for each of you to consider:

Churches typically receive as much as 25% of our gifts in the last two months of the year. As you make your plans to complete your 2013 financial commitment, here are three additional possibilities for resources beyond cash gifts. Please note that these possibilities are listed for educational purposes. Please consult your personal advisor for your specific information.

1. Gifts of Appreciated Stocks or Bonds

You can transfer ownership of stocks, bonds or mutual funds to the church and receive a charitable tax deduction based on the full fair market value of the securities on the date of the transfer. This avoids the capital gains tax while giving the church the benefit of the full value of the security. To receive this benefit, it is important to transfer ownership before the security is sold. For your gift to apply to the current tax year, the securities must be in the account of the local church (or our Foundation) by December 31st. So, allow plenty of lead time for your broker to complete this transaction.

2. Gifts of Real Estate

A charitable gift of real estate can be especially tax advantageous. If a home, vacation home, acreage or farm property has appreciated in value over the years - its sale could result in a sizable capital gains tax. If the real estate is given to the church prior to the sale, you can avoid the tax and realize a charitable deduction for the full fair market value of the real estate. One could even consider a bargain sale transaction with half of the funds to the church and the other half to the donor.

3. Gifts of Life Insurance

When you name the church as the owner and beneficiary of a life insurance policy, it usually offers you a tax advantage in the year you make the gift. You can take a charitable deduction approximately equal to the cash value at the time of the gift. Additionally, continued payments of premiums qualify as charitable tax deductions each year.

Community Thanksgiving Service: We will not have evening worship on November 24th. Instead, we will be joining with churches in our community at 6:00 pm on the 24th of this month for a Community Thanksgiving Service at Shades Crest Baptist Church. Our own Rev. Mike Holly will be preaching!

Permanent Endowment Funds: The market value of our Permanent Endowment Funds (Missions, General Ministries and Building) was \$639,897 at the end of the 3rd quarter of CY2013. Our earnings for the 3rd quarter were \$1835 bringing the total earnings since the funds were established in 1993 to \$304,503. Our funds had a gain in the market value of \$16,491 for the 3rd quarter of CY2013. For the first nine months of 2013, we have a gain in market value of \$30,803. Contributions may be made to the Funds at any time and in any amount. The contributions remain in the Funds permanently along with the change-of-value. However, the **income** from the Permanent Endowment Funds supports unexpected, unbudgeted expenses which sometimes arise during the year. Our Permanent Endowment Funds are invested with the United Methodist Foundation of North Alabama in the 'Balanced Fund'. The Foundation, in turn, invests in fixed income and equity instruments in a ratio which they and their advisers feel yields the greatest possible returns in prevailing market conditions.
